School Development Priorities 2018-19

Each year as a school we evaluate where we are and decide where we would like to be. We never become complacent and are always striving to be better for the children of Kingsfold. This year we have been working on the three main priorities below. Along with these we have been completing many other areas of development ranging from parental involvement via Seesaw, ParentPay, extra curricular activities, Sports, etc.

- 1. From their starting point, children should make at least good progress towards age related expectations in reading, writing and mathematics.
- 2. Increase the percentage of children passing the phonics screening.
- Develop an effective and consistent system to monitor and track age related expectations across the school.
