## Covid Update

### Daily testing for close contacts of COVID-19

People who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, should take a LFT every day for seven days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time.

Children under 5 are not being advised to take part in daily testing of close contacts. If a child under 5 is a contact of a confirmed case, they are not required to self-isolate and should not start daily testing.

### CO2 Monitors

The Government has now completed their programme of providing CO2 monitors to all schools. These are now in all classrooms.

The additional monitors will improve the quality of monitoring across all occupied spaces and prompt the opening of windows and doors to ensure areas remain well-ventilated.

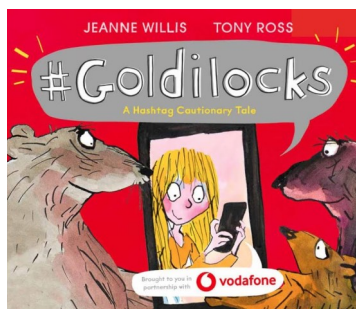
### Loose bubbles
